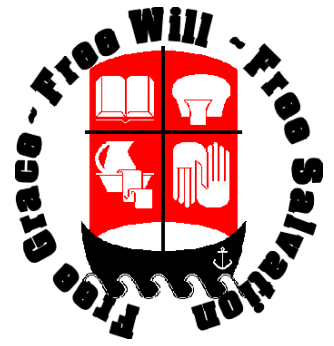

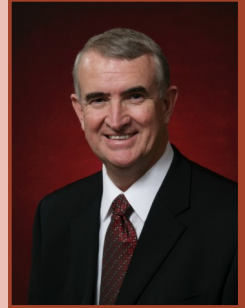

Why Are Our Churches Growing

Admittedly all of our churches are not growing. In fact our overall numbers are down. In 1977 the Alabama State Association of Free Will Baptists had 180 churches with a membership of 20,000 and we are now reporting 140 churches with a membership of 14,420. However, in recent weeks I have visited some very exciting Alabama Free Will Baptist churches that are growing. They are diverse in that some are rural and some are urban. There is one thing in common with each one though. They all take seriously the Great Commission. They believe in the GO of the gospel and they believe in giving so others can go. They are not just inwardly focused. It's the Dead Sea versus the Sea of Galilee principle. You see both of these bodies of water are in Israel. Both are fed by the Jordan river. This is where the similarities stop. The Sea of Galilee is full of life and beauty. The Dead Sea is just that, dead and lifeless. The difference is the Dead Sea receives but does not give out while the Sea of Galilee does. If a church wants to be full of life, beauty and growth it must give out by **GOing**. It must believe Jesus when He said "go and I will go with you." It must be engaging its Jerusalem by giving out the Gospel. It too must believe Jesus when He said "**GIVE** and it will be given you." It must be getting light to the rest of the world by giving so others can go with the life giving gospel. If a church wants the smile of God upon it then it must be all about telling others about His son. Churches will **grow** if they will **go** and if they will **give**.

It was a great time of fellowship and we were honored to have Glenda Fulcher and her daughter Susan visit us for this special event. Bill and Glenda Fulcher were the first FWB missionaries to come to Uruguay. It was a touching thing to see Glenda reunite with adults who were children when she arrived. We were also honored to have International Missions Director Clint Morgan who presented the National Association with a plaque and then preached a very challenging sermon.

We are preparing to leave on the 27th of January and will probably be in the States when you read this. Please pray for our churches while we are away. We have a church that is being infiltrated by a Pentecostal church and those people are wanting to be members. The idea is to get the majority and take over the church. Pray for our pastors as they work through these problems that the church will be strong and effective.

Pray for Pastor Julio. We made a special trip with Clint to visit the Melo church and it was worth the extra miles. We all left this meeting with Julio encouraged about the work there. A couple weeks ago he even had a lady who was the daughter of the spiritist who lived in front of the church ask for prayer. Mike Corley (Russia) Our brothers and sisters in Russia appreciate Alabama FWBs. The church planters we are supporting are doing well and their congregations are growing, slowly but surely. One of the exciting areas is the church planter in Gulkevitchij. Sasha and his church have opened a rehabilitation center and, together with the Holy Spirit, they are making a difference in the lives of drug addicts and alcoholics. Some of these men (they are hoping to soon open a rehab center for women, as well), after getting their lives turned around, are thinking of going into full time ministry. What a blessing! They send New Year's greetings to all of you who help support them. But, this New Year brings new challenges. Did you know that only about 25% of all FWB churches actively support world evangelism? However, about 75% of Alabama FWB churches are involved. I want to thank Bro. Cash and Alabama's Acts 1:8 program for being a large factor in putting Alabama churches ahead of the norm. However, world evangelism is a 365 day, 24/7 job that can't be done through a token, once a year contribution during the Mission Conference. I challenge each church and individual to reevaluate your level of participation. We will soon have about half of all FWB international missionaries back in the US and they will not be able to return to the field unless we all step up and increase giving to world evangelism through programs like the Acts 1:8 program. 2. We had many visitors, including several unbelievers, attend our Christmas program. It was exciting to see the youth involved, who did a great job organizing much of the program.
3. The Food Bank (from the province of Madrid) came to visit our church and approved us to receive groceries for the social outreach. We hope to soon start giving out fruits and vegetables as well as nonperishable items. We will be working with both the Food Bank as well as the Comunidad (State) of Madrid in this next phase of the ministry.
4. We recently met, along with other missionaries, with the pastors of all our FWB Churches in Spain for a meal. We praise God for their perseverance and willingness to serve especially during these difficult times, both spiritually and economically. Please continue to pray for Jhon Fredy (our pastor in Villalba), Juan Carlos (Colmenar Viejo) and José Manuel (Alcalá).

Tim Riggs (Mobile) - We had a good Christmas season here at our church. One of the highlights was our annual Christmas program which for the first time was presented by our church choir. They worked hard and God honored their efforts. On the night of the program we had 95 present with several visitors. Almost all of the visitors were prospects who are not in church. WORLD MISSIONS OFFERING

Free Will Baptist International Mission Director Clint Morgan remembers his first Sunday in Côte d'Ivoire: "Although just out of French language school, and feeling quite inadequate in my language skills, the church leaders asked me to give the message that Sunday. After hesitantly working my way through the message I had written almost word for word, **Moussa – an old, gray-haired man – inched on wobbly legs to the altar.** I reached out my hand to speak to him and, through a translator, he said he wanted to become a Christian. It is impossible for me to even dare to express the awe I felt at that moment."

Moussa heard the gospel because people like us give to support our missionaries' efforts around the world. Women, children, and men like Moussa need us more than ever.

One way we can participate in saving souls around the world today is by participating in the **World Missions Offering** on April 29, 2012. We in Alabama have a tremendous legacy of support for International Missions. Alabama sent Jimmy & Janie Aldridge and Dave & Pat Franks to Côte d'Ivoire and Brazil, respectively, almost half a century ago. We currently have missionaries from Alabama serving in Uruguay, Spain and a restricted access country.

About 80 Alabama Free Will Baptist churches have participated in the WMO over the last 8 years, and last year about 38 churches gave about \$42,000 to the WMO. **Thank you** for what you did last year, and in previous years. This year we must do more. God is still doing His part, and we must continue to do ours. Free Will Baptist International Missions is facing a financial crisis. Those of us whom God has blessed so richly must do our part.

Please partner with International Missions to carry out the Great Commission by giving regularly, and by making a special gift to the WMO. The financial lifeblood of International Missions comes from those churches and individuals who give faithfully every month, but the WMO will likely provide about 10% of the total IM budget for 2012. Free Will Baptist Bible College: The fall 2011 semester at Free Will Baptist Bible College ended with 89 students earning academic recognition, according to Provost Greg Ketteman.
